NZ AutoTraps AT220

TARGET: POSSUMS & RATS

WHAT IT IS

The AT220 is a self-resetting, auto-luring kill trap targeting possums and rats. This trap uses an electric motor and rechargeable battery to reset the trap. The battery lasts for up to 100 cycles or 6 months between servicing.

HOW IT WORKS

The AT220 is triggered by a photoelectric sensor detecting the presence of an animal. Once triggered, and the automatic reset cycle is complete, the trap dispenses a small amount of bait to entice more pests. This trap has two 'kill zones' – one for possums and the other for rats. Rats are killed via a kill bar (as with standard DOC series traps).

Possums are killed with the same kill bar however they are required to put their head into the trap via a 'keyhole', where the bar closes on the possum's neck.

HOW EFFECTIVE IT IS

With a constant supply of fresh lure and immediate reset, this trap is highly effective at catching rats and possums with minimal input from staff. Its auto-reset capability cuts down the time needed to reset and service.

INSTALLATION

The AT220 should be mounted on a tree or post approximately 1.5 m off the ground, with a ramp leading to the trap. It has a mount, for ease of installation, and should be screwed into the tree/post with the entrance of the trap facing the ground. This provides a safe height to ensure that livestock cannot interfere with the trap and allows captured animals to fall to the ground, leaving the trap ready for the next catch.

SAFETY

The AT220 has a daytime 'lockout' or shutdown function, preventing operation during daylight hours. This reduces the risk of children or non-target animals setting it off. Traps should be installed where children are not able to easily access them.

The type of lure used (a mayonnaise-based mixture) also reduces the risk of potential by-catch. In some situations, primarily in close proximity to residential dwellings with domestic animals, the removal of the 'ramp' can further reduce risks...

LURE

This is an auto-luring trap. It uses a mayonnaise mixture lure that is dispensed once the trap has reset itself. The trap will also re-lure after a two-day period to keep it fresh and appealing.

DISPOSAL OF CARCASSES

The disposal of carcasses is carried out within the proximity of the trap, under a tree or bush. This allows the nutrients of the animal to be absorbed back into the ecosystem.
